**Lecturer, "Ecological Transition for a Sustainable Development", 2nd year undergraduate classes** 2025-2026  
*Agriculture, Development and Ecological Transition | Université Sorbonne Paris Nord*

- The lecture was organised in three sessions, covering two themes.
- The first theme focused on the geopolitical context surrounding the emergence of the concept of development.
- The consequences this context had on the debates surrounding the definition of the concept.
- The relationship between defining development and measuring it.
- The second theme questioned the role of agriculture in development.
- It focuses on the contribution and challenges primary production and trade pose to development.
- It questions contemporary challenges such as the financialisation of agricultural global value chains using the example of the 2006 Food Price Crisis.
